Update on Cuba:

(report from special guests Ary and Beidy pastors at the Presbyterian church in Matanzas)

Ary - Since Covid the situation in Cuba

is dire. The economy has worsened, its tourism has dropped from 4 million/year to 1 million (most Canadian tourists to Cuba are going to Dominican Republic now). Likewise, due to the Russian war in Ukraine fewer Russian tourists visit Cuba. Russia is recruiting Cubans to fight in Ukraine although there is no official support or recognition of this by Cuba.

As well as the embargo restricting trade, recent financial and economic reforms in Cuba are having a negative effect on daily life. Cuba once huge exporter of sugar now imports **all** of its sugar. Russia has sent economic advisors to Cuba to assist in transforming the economy. Ary noted that rather than promoting the growing of food stuffs the government has chosen to sell off some of its land for industrial development to Russian interests in anticipation of an emerging capitalist society. There are over 80,000 small private businesses in Cuba but only a few with connections to government officials seem to be successful.

There is high inflation, a shortage of food, water and both cooking and heating oil. There is no diesel fuel for public transportation and electrical power generation. Without fuel widespread and prolonged power outages are common everywhere, including hospitals, and transportation systems have collapsed.

The US and other countries (Haiti, Venezuela and Nicaragua) participate in a "Parole" program (Cuban Family Reunification Parole) that allows Cuban families to be sponsored by citizens of another country while they wait for their visa. Currently more than 300,000 people are waiting for visas under this program.

Last year, over 250,000 left Cuba, mostly young professionals and their families, to date this year over 50,000 have left.

Beidy spoke regarding the women in Cuba and their changing role. Domestic violence against women has increased. Women's responsibilities have increased with the departure of so many of the men to other counties seeking work. The women are left to cope in a survival mode. As their pastor, Beidy sees the raw reality to which women are exposed in trying to care for their families including procuring food and supplies. Beidy has no rest, receiving calls at all hours for help. It is extremely difficult.

Education of the youth is suffering on many fronts. They lack the basic supplies, and the few teachers left are distracted by their conflicting roles, teaching and looking out for family. They are on the phone constantly seeking out food, cooking oil, etc., and leave the school at a moment's notice to find these supplies when they become available. The elderly line up in the streets overnight waiting for the government shops to open in the morning in hopes that they might be able to buy much needed but scarce supplies.

There is a general sense of hopelessness and despair, making it difficult for churches to offer hope. Recently, 6 Presbyterian pastors have left Cuba for the USA but those that remain are very committed to their work. As Ary put it, "the good news is we are still alive". He also said that although our gifts and money help, what would be appreciated even more is for us to visit Cuba to show solidarity with them. They long for our hugs and presence. Both Ary and Beidy said for those thinking of visiting not to be concerned about consuming food that would better serve our Cuban friends; they will manage and share what they have, just please come.
